In this training session you will:

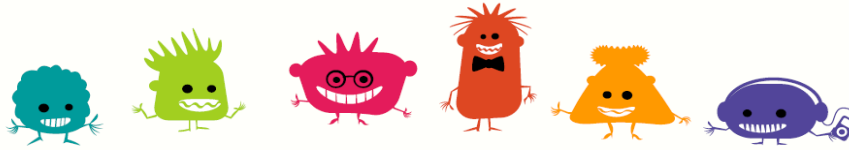
- Discover ways to integrate active learning through music into the curriculum.
 - Take part in hands-on activities which aim to give class teachers the confidence to “do it themselves”.
- Learn songs and games from the three stage pack which links directly to the learning outcomes of Scotland’s Curriculum for Excellence, and acts as a springboard for holistic development.

Teachers and curriculum leaders will go away with ideas to use with children aged 3 – 7.

The Active Learning programme is running successfully in many schools throughout Scotland, from a tiny rural school on the west coast, to a busy school on the east coast, where an enthusiastic member of staff is working with pupils with additional support needs. It is going to be in every school in the Highlands next session, and is also being piloted in a school in Northern Ireland.
